COACHING CAREER NOTES: In 2023-24, helped lead Hershey capture its ninth first-place league finish while setting franchise single-season record for points percentage (.771) and most wins (53) in a 72-game AHL season schedule, earning first career Louis A.R. Pieri Memorial Award as AHL's outstanding coach...Moved up from 13th to eighth on AHL's coaching wins list...Represented Hershey at All-Star Classic for record-setting fourth All-Star head coach selection...Earned 30th win in 39th game of season to set franchise record for fastest 30 wins in a season...Earned 400th AHL head coaching win on March 30 at Hartford...Coached 700th game as AHL head coach on April 6 at Iowa...Passed Frank Mathers for fourth in Calder Cup Playoffs coaching wins with 60th career victory on May 16 vs Hartford...Earned 70th AHL playoff win and third Calder Cup as head coach with 5-4 overtime win on June 24 vs Coachella Valley... In 2022-23, began first season as head coach of the Hershey Bears after being named to the position on Aug. 11...Guided Hershey to its best start at GIANT Center with 8-0-1-0 point streak to begin season...Earned 500th pro head coaching win on Jan. 14 in 6-2 win vs Springfield...Coached 600th AHL game on Jan. 21 at Belleville...Named head coach of Atlantic Division at 2023 AHL All-Star Classic...Coached 900th pro game on March 24 at Rochester...Achieved highest career single-season points percentage in a full season as a head coach (.674)...Led Hershey to its 70th playoff appearance and 12th Calder Cup in franchise history...Became the 10th head coach in franchise history to lead Hershey to Calder Cup... In 2019-20, helped Dallas reach Stanley Cup Final vs Tampa Bay Lightning in Edmonton bubble... In 2018-19, left Grand Rapids for assistant coach role with Dallas Stars, under former Bears forward Jim Montgomery; appointed to position on May 31... In 2017-18, earned his 300th AHL head coaching win with a 2-1 victory at Milwaukee on March 20... In 2016-17, led Grand Rapids to its second Calder Cup championship in franchise history and his first as a head coach, becoming only the third player in AHL history to win the Calder Cup as a player (1994), assistant coach (2008), and head coach, joining Bob Woods and Mike Stothers...Named head coach of Central Division All-Stars for 2017 AHL All-Star Classic... In 2015-16, was named head coach of Grand Rapids on June 16...15-game win streak from Nov. 18-Dec. 26...Earned his 200th AHL head coaching win with 3-2 OT win at Lake Erie on Jan. 20... In 2014-15, began season with Oklahoma City before taking over for Dallas Eakins as interim head coach on Dec. 15...Guided Oklahoma City to a 15-6-4 record and first place in the West Division, including a 10-game point streak from Nov. 15-Dec. 6 before being elevated to Edmonton... In 2011-12, named head coach of Western Conference All-Stars for 2012 AHL All-Star Classic... In 2010-11, was named as the first head coach of the inaugural Oklahoma City Barons for his first head-coaching role in AHL... In 2007-08, served on the staff of John Anderson as Chicago claimed its second Calder Cup in franchise history with a 4-2 series win over Wilkes-Barre/Scranton... In 2003-04, accepted head coach role with Muskegon and won back-to-back Colonial Cups... In 2002-03, moved on to Grand Rapids Griffins as assistant coach... In 2001-02, served in a coaching role for the first time as an assistant coach/player with Muskegon Fury of UHL.

PLAYING CAREER NOTES: Amassed 168 points (37g, 131a) and 223 penalty minutes in 306 career AHL games skating for Portland, Hershey, Rochester and Grand Rapids, highlighted by a 1994 Calder Cup championship with the Portland Pirates...Also won a UHL Colonial Cup in 2002 with Muskegon Fury, and appeared in 2000 IHL Turner Cup Finals with Grand Rapids...Nelson was the first-ever signing in Grand Rapids history prior to its inaugural 1996-97 IHL season...Nelson made his NHL debut with the Pittsburgh Penguins in the 1991-92 season, appearing in one game...He also skated in two games for the Washington Capitals in 1993-94, scoring once in two games, and appearing in four additional playoff contests...Nelson also played the 1998-99 season in the DEL with Berlin, and began the 1999-00 season with Finland's SM-liiga with HIFK before returning stateside...Nelson made back-to-back IHL All-Star Game appearances with the Muskegon/Cleveland franchise in 1992 and 1993...Nelson was a fourth-round selection by Pittsburgh in the 1989 NHL Entry Draft.

HERSHEY BEARS: COACHES BIOGRAPHIES

ASSISTANT COACH: NICK BOOTLAND

Nick Bootland returned to Hershey as an assistant coach ahead of the 2022-23 season after a 13-year run as the head coach of the ECHL's Kalamazoo Wings. Bootland played parts of four seasons for the Bears between 1998-03 prior to moving behind the bench in 2008. In his first two years on Todd Nelson's staff, Bootland helped guide Hershey to back-to-back Calder Cup championships and claim the Macgregor Kilpatrick Trophy with a franchise-record .771 points percentage in the 2023-24 regular season.

Bootland became head coach of Kalamazoo in 2008-09 when the club was a member of the International Hockey League, and continued with the organization in its shift to the ECHL. He owned a coaching record of 481-366-82 in 929 career IHL and ECHL games with Kalamazoo, helping the club qualify for the playoffs nine times. His 853 games coached and 437 wins in the ECHL rank seventh and eighth respectively in league history.

While at the helm of Kalamazoo, he guided the Wings to an appearance in the 2011 Kelly Cup Finals and in his tenure, the team won four division titles and one conference championship.

In his 10-year playing career, the forward amassed over 300 games in the AHL, lacing up his skates with both Cleveland and Hershey, where he appeared in 208 career games with the Chocolate and White, posting 42 points (15g, 27a) and 350 penalty minutes. The Shelburne, Ontario native spent the final three seasons of his career in Kalamazoo, serving as team captain. In 2006, he led the K-Wings to a UHL championship, capturing Colonial Cup Playoffs Most Valuable Player honors with 16 points (10g, 6a) in 13 playoff games.

ASSISTANT COACH: PATRICK WELLAR

Patrick Wellar returned to Hershey as an assistant coach ahead of the 2018-19 season after playing parts of six seasons with the Bears from 2008-2014.

Under his watch, the Bears were the AHL's best defensive team in 2020-21, allowing just 2.33 goals per game, en route to winning the Macgregor Kilpatrick Trophy as AHL regular season champions. In 2022-23, Hershey allowed a league-low 26.19 shots against per game and finished second out of 32 teams in the regular season allowing just 2.56 goals per game, before winning the 2023 Calder Cup championship. In 2023-24, the Bears yielded the fewest goals against per game (2.10) and shots against per game (25.97) of any team in the league en route to another Kilpatrick Trophy and a second consecutive Calder Cup championship.

A former defender, Wellar was a stalwart on Hershey's blue line during his playing career. He was part of Hershey's 2010 Calder Cup Championship team that went 60-17-0-3 in regular season play before ultimately claiming the franchise's 11th title. In total, the Carrot River, Saskatchewan native appeared in 260 games with Hershey, scoring 46 points (7 goals, 39 assists), and posting a +24 rating. He also appeared in 36 playoff contests with the club.

Following his departure from Hershey, Wellar served as a player/assistant coach with the ECHL's Utah Grizzlies in 2014-15, and Alaska Aces in 2015-16. Upon his retirement, Wellar moved behind the bench permanently as an assistant coach with the ECHL's Cincinnati Cyclones, guiding the club to a 36-29-6-1 record in 2016-17. He joined the ECHL's Reading Royals for the 2017-18 season in the same capacity, helping the club secure a playoff berth with a 39-24-9-0 record, good for third place in the North Division.

In his 12-year playing career, Wellar, a third-round selection of the Capitals in 2002, amassed over 300 games in the AHL, making stops in Peoria, Worcester, Toronto, and Hershey. His resume also includes 441 games at the ECHL level, including an All-Star Game appearance in 2005. Wellar won the Kelly Cup three times, including with Alaska in 2006, South Carolina in 2009, and Reading in 2013.

ASSOCIATE GOALTENDING COACH: JUHA LEHTOLA

Juha Lehtola was hired as associate goaltending coach in August 2022, bringing experience in both North America and overseas to the club's netminders. Lehtola helped mentor goaltender Hunter Shepard, as the goalie captured the Jack Butterfield Trophy as MVP of the 2023 Calder Cup Playoffs and Hershey won the Calder Cup. In 2023-24, Shepard and Clay Stevenson shared the Harry "Hap" Holmes Memorial Award, while Shepard led the league in goals-against average and save percentage, winning the Aldedge "Baz" Bastien Memorial Award as the league's outstanding goaltender, and Hershey repeated as Calder Cup champions.

Lehtola joined the Bears from his native Finland where he worked with in the country's top league, Liiga, for HPK Hameenlinna as goaltending coach and video coach since 2016. He was part of HPK's 2018-19 club that won the league championship, and the former netminder was a product of HPK's junior program during his playing days.

The native of Hameenlinna, Finland was selected as the goaltending coach for Finland in the 2021 and 2022 World Junior Championships.

From 2011-13, Lehtola worked alongside Washington Capitals goalie coach Scott Murray with the Ontario Hockey League's Sudbury Wolves. He served as Murray's assistant goaltending coach and also held the video coach title during the 2011-13 campaign.
