History of Flyers in the Valley

Fifth Annual Rookie Series Continues Tradition

Allentown, PA—The NHL once again returns to PPL Center as the Lehigh Valley welcomes an early start to hockey season in September. This weekend, it's the Philadelphia Flyers and New York Rangers renewing rivalry acquaintances in downtown Allentown.

There's something uniquely special about September hockey. And the opportunity to host games first and before almost every other city in North America, and at the NHL level, has been embraced by the region and its massive base of enthusiastic hockey fanatics.

Game 1 of the Rookie Series is Saturday, September 12 at 7:05 and the two teams will rematch on Sunday, September 13 at 5:05.

The tradition of the Lehigh Valley hosting the NHL dates back to the beginning of the PPL Center in 2014 and the Flyers have been regularly arriving for preseasons games in downtown Allentown ever since. The Rookie Series began in 2022 with the Philadelphia Flyers and New York Rangers. A new chapter of the "Flyers in the Valley" story unfolded with the Flyers taking a pair of games by scores of 2-1 (OT) and 5-1.

The Rangers countered in 2023 with back-to-back wins in Allentown including a third-period rally for a 4-2 decision in the opener followed by 5-1 verdict in the finale. New York Rangers tough guy Matt Rempe came ready to play and the hulking 6'8" tall enforcer showcased his abilities before becoming the talk of the NHL just a few weeks later. Those games also represented Philadelphia's first-ever regulation losses at PPL Center. The 2024 edition featured the North American debut of 19-year-old sensation Matvei Michkov as well as an overtime winner by Samu Tuomaala set up by Emil Andrae and Jett Luchanko as the Rangers and Flyers split a pair of extra-time decisions.

The 2025 edition saw Denver Barkey score his first goal as a Flyer and then Nikita Grebenkin slamming home an overtime winner in a 4-3 opener before the Rangers countered with a 5-2 decision in the finale.

The games this weekend represent the 11th occasion for the National Hockey League to call the Queen City home, if only for one very special weekend. The Flyers are 7-3-3 all-time at PPL Center in various Rookie and preseason games against the New York Rangers, New York Islanders and New Jersey Devils.

The games will be watched closely by the management and coaches of these proud NHL franchises with their first looks of the season at some of their future star players.

September 27, 2014 – Orange 5 – White 3 "Battle on Hamilton!"

The first time fans got to see the winged "P" design of the Philadelphia Flyers at PPL Center was also the first-ever professional hockey exhibition in the Lehigh Valley. The historic night before a sold-out crowd enjoyed a Flyers intrasquad contest at the brand-new, state-of-the-art PPL Center. The buzz was palpable and the energy was high as the hockey-hungry region showed how well the newest AHL city would thrive in its sparkling, new venue.

Phantoms head coach Terry Murray was at the Team Orange bench for this contest and was thrilled with what he saw for the brand-new hockey market. "I think this is a hockey place. It's a hockey city. I'm not surprised at all that the crowd was as energetic and full as it was today. They're telling us they want more of it and we're ready to get going!"

Team White defenseman Brett Flemming scored the first-ever goal at PPL Center with a shot from the right point with Mark Alt and Zac Rinaldo providing assists on the history-making tally. Team Orange rallied against goalie Anthony Stolarz to post the come-from-behind win for the thrilled crowd who enjoyed their first experience at the city's dazzling and impressive new venue.

September 21, 2015 – Philadelphia Flyers 5 – New York Islanders 3

The Lehigh Valley's first preseason game between two NHL teams saw Claude Giroux, Jake Voracek and Michael Del Zotto lead the Flyers to a 5-3 victory against the Islanders. The debut of "Flyers in the Valley" saw Del Zotto register a goal with an assist while Jake Voracek added a pair of helpers before a raucous crowd of 8,000 orange-clad fans thrilled to watch some of their favorite NHL stars right here in Allentown. Michael Raffl scored less than six minutes in with a power-play strike off a perfectly placed touched pass from Jake Voracek. Giroux set up a key goal for Del Zotto early in the third period and just one minute after the Islanders had rallied to tie the score at 3-3.

September 28, 2016 – Philadelphia Flyers 2 – New Jersey Devils 0

The NHL returned to PPL Center with a 2-0 victory over the New Jersey Devils. 2015 first-round pick Travis Konecny impressed in his Flyers' debut with a goal and an

September 20, 2017 – Philadelphia Flyers 3 – New York Islanders 2 (OT)

Shayne Gostisbehere returned to PPL Center and scored the overtime-winning goal in a thriller at PPL Center. Taylor Leier scored twice in regulation. Nolan Patrick set up Ghost's backdoor slam in the opening minute of the 3-on-3 session to cap an exciting night of NHL action in Center City Allentown. It was Ghost's second-ever goal at PPL Center as the Flyers improved their Allentown record to 3-0. Newcomer and highly hyped prospect Mathew Barzal showcased his abilities in his Islanders' debut with a 5-on-3 tally.

September 21, 2018 – NY Islanders 3 – Philadelphia Flyers 2 (OT)

Hockey once again returned to PPL Center as the fans welcomed back the NHL Stars with the fourth edition of "Flyers in the Valley." Ryan Pulock blasted home the winner from the left circle on a power-play slam in overtime to end Philadelphia's winning streak in Allentown. Shayne Gostisbehere and Travis Konecny scored for the Flyers.

Fans enjoyed seeing James van Riemsdyk and Jake Voracek solidify their games in the preseason tune-up as well as the Flyers debut of a young goaltender named Carter Hart. The highly hyped prospect and two-time CHL Goalie of the Year saw game competition at PPL Center for his first time ever and played very well during his 30 minutes of action which included some key stops during an Islanders 5-on-3 power play in the second period.

September 11, 2019 – NY Islanders 5 – Philadelphia Flyers 4 (SO)

In the first NHL Rookie Game hosted by PPL Center, the New York Islanders overcame a 3-0 deficit to record a 5-4 shootout decision in a see-saw game. Joel Farabee had almost won the game in overtime with a breakaway and then a shot off the post. Farabee's line with Morgan Frost and Isaac Ratcliffe drew a lot of attention as well as praise. The forecheck pressure of Frost and Ratcliffe provided each with an assist as they helped set up the team's 2-0 lead on a goal by Sean Comrie. Felix Sandstrom held off the Islanders for his 32 minutes with 24 saves on 25 shots but New York later surged back with consecutive goals to open the third period to tie the score at 4-4. Oliver Wahlstrom scored the lone shootout goal for either side.

September 15, 2023 – New York Rangers 4 – Philadelphia Flyers 2

The New York Rangers broke a third-period 2-2 tie on a goal by Ryder Korczak then held off the Flyers the rest of the way. It was the first-ever regulation loss for the Flyers at PPL Center. Matt Brown and Alex Ciernik scored for Philadelphia while the Rangers had goals from Karl Henriksson, Dylan Roobroeck, Ryder Korczak and Matt Robertson. Zayde Wisdom gave up a lot of size to 6-foot-7 Matt Rempe but held his own in a brief and spirited scrap in which he was able to connect with his behemoth opponent.

September 16, 2023 – New York Rangers 3 – Philadelphia Flyers 1

Zayde Wisdom scored the lone goal for Philadelphia but the Rangers were led by a pair of goals from Bobby Trevigno to complete the sweep. Luke McNamara picked up the first goal of the game for New York beating 18-year-old goaltender Carson Bjarnasson who went the distance. Olaf Lindbom and Talyn Boyko shared the goaltending duties for the Rangers.

September 13, 2024 – New York Rangers 4 – Philadelphia Flyers 3 (SO)

Matvei Michkov's first game in North America was pretty unforgettable. The 19-year-old Russian phenom scored his first goal on United States ice and almost converted on other key chances. Massimo Rizzo's first game wearing the Orange and Black was pretty cool as well. The former University of Denver standout assisted on Michkov's goal and then later scored a dramatic tying tally with just 14.4 seconds left in the third period as part of a wild and exciting night filled with terrific scoring chances and breathtaking hockey. Ultimately, the New York Rangers landed a 4-3 shootout win on Brennan Othmann's conversion in the second round to take Game 1 of the NHL Rookie Series.



September 16, 2022 – Philadelphia Flyers 2 – New York Rangers 1 (OT)

The NHL returned to PPL Center for the first time in three years. And Boy, did it ever! Tyson Foerster scored the overtime winner in the opening game of the Rookie Series to propel the Philadelphia Flyers to a 2-1 victory over the New York Rangers who were making their first-ever appearance to Center City Allentown. Along with Foerster's winner came an impressive goal by newcomer Olle Lycksell who was flying up the right wing in the second period to score a five-hole beauty. It was the perfect way to welcome hockey back to the corner of Seventh and Hamilton.

September 17, 2022 – Philadelphia Flyers 5 – New York Rangers 1

The Flyers completed a weekend sweep of their Big Apple rivals with Noah Cates leading the way on a shorthanded goal and an assist. His shortie in the second period was assisted by his brother, Jackson Cates. Olle Lycksell scored for a second night in a row and added a pair of helpers while defensemen Egor Zamula and Ronnie Attard both rifled home lamplighters for the Orange and Black. Zayde Wisdom notched a goal for the Flyers as well. Sam Ersson made 36 saves in his triumphant return from injury but had his shutout bid broken by New York's Bobby

September 14, 2024 – Philadelphia Flyers 3 – New York Rangers 2 (OT)

Samu Tuomaala scored the overtime winner to down the Rangers in overtime culminating the third Rookie Series weekend at PPL Center. Jett Luchanko was true to his name “Jetting” into the zone to connect with Emil Andrae who found Tuomaala on the backdoor for the slam-dunk winner. Adam Edstrom’s third goal of the weekend for the Rangers set a new Rookie Series record.

September 13, 2025 – Nikita Grebenkin put the finishing touches on a high-energy thriller as fans welcomed the return of hockey at PPL Center in an exciting opening act in the fourth annual Rookie Series at PPL Center. Grebenkin’s overtime goal less than one minute into the extra frame capped a strong performance for the second-year pro while proclaiming his intentions to land a spot on the Opening Night roster in Philadelphia. Denver Barkey broke through with Philadelphia’s first goal of the night while Alexis Gendron and Jacob Gaucher, also scored for the Oragne and Black. The Rangers were led by returning Rookie Series nemeses Brennan Othmann and Dylan Roobroeck who both scored in the first period. Raoul Boilard put New York back in front late in the second before Gaucher equalized for Philly midway through the third. The game also marked new Lehigh Valley head coach John Snowden’s first game as a bench boss at PPL Center.

September 14, 2025 – The New York Rangers pushed through to pick up a split on the weekend in the fourth annual NHL Rookie Series at PPL Center with a 5-2 win on Saturday night. Philadelphia won the opener on Friday in a 4-3 overtime thriller. The Rangers were led by Scott Morrow who scored one goal and added two assists in the Saturday game as part of a five-point weekend (1-4-5). The Flyers received goals from Alexis Gendron and Ethan Samson while Nikita Greenkin assisted on both less than 24 hours after his overtime capper on Friday.

THE FLYERS ROOKIE TEAM

Barkey, Bonk, Bump, Martone, Sokolovskii Among Spotlight Players

The Rookie Series is back at PPL Center this weekend and the Philadelphia Flyers are bringing a loaded lineup packed with NHL experience, exciting prospects, future stars, first-rounders, and professional debuts.

SPOTLIGHT PLAYERS

These players either already have NHL experience or are 1st round picks in their Draft +1 or Draft +2 season.

Denver Barkey (W/C): Played 43 regular season NHL games plus 10 playoff games for the Flyers last season. As such, he does not technically qualify as a “rookie” under the CBA but he qualifies for Rookie Camp as an entry-level contract player entering his second season. For him, Rookie Camp is a potential springboard toward solidifying his NHL role in the main camp.

Oliver Bonk (D): A Rookie Camp injury set the 2023 first-round pick back last September. He missed the early season for the Phantoms. He settled in progressively upon his return. Bonk appeared in one regular season match and one playoff match for the Flyers. He may not start the 2026-27 season in the NHL but he will push to challenge for a spot at some point this year.



Alex Bump (W): Played 17 regular season games plus six playoff matches for the Flyers last season. His bigger challenge will come at the NHL camp, where he'll try to earn an opening night roster spot this time around.

Jett Luchanko (C/W): The 2024 first-round pick is coming off core muscle surgery to repair an issue that lingered for 18 months. He's under a lot of pressure to have a quick start. However, the Flyers won't rush the now 20-year-old forward.

Porter Martone (W): The sixth overall pick of the 2025 Draft made an immediate NHL splash late last season. Martone retains rookie status under the CBA but his Flyers stint burned the first year off his entry-level contract. Martone is the player who will get the most fan attention at camp.

Ty Murchison (D): The defensive defenseman enters his second full pro season. He impressed with the Phantoms (29 games) and the Flyers (3 games) last year before suffering a season-ending upper-body injury. He's a dark horse for an NHL roster spot out of camp. However, he stands a good chance at an NHL recall within the season.

Maksim Sokolovskii (D): The hulking—but mobile—2026 first-round pick will head back to the OHL's London Knights before the start of the regular season. At Rookie Camp, he'll look to build off an impressive showing at Development Camp.

FIRST-YEAR PROS

This group of players is set to play their first (or first full) season of professional hockey. Their development is worth tracking.

Brady Berard (F): Berard, 22, aims to make the transition from NCAA (Providence and Boston College) into professional hockey this season. The Phantoms signed him to an AHL contract for the 2026–27 season. Berard is the son of college coach David and the brother of Montreal Canadiens player Brett Berard. Not related to former NHL defenseman Bryan Berard.

Alex Ciernik (W): The skilled but inconsistent 2023 fourth-round pick has come to North America for his first full season. He aims to gain a regular AHL spot with the Phantoms over the next year.

Spencer Gill (D): The Flyers remain high on the huge-framed but also mobile and skilled blueliner. He dealt with significant injuries the last two seasons. Nevertheless, the 2024 second-round pick enjoyed a strong finish to his 2025-26 season once he made a healthy return late in the season. He hopes to parlay it into an impressive rookie AHL season.

Cole Knuble (W/C): Versatile second-generation member of the Flyers enjoyed a solid collegiate career at Notre Dame. He also played well in a late season AHL spell with the Phantoms. Knuble saw time at wing and center with Lehigh Valley.

Owen McLaughlin (C): The 23-year-old Chester County native is on a minor league contract. The former North Dakota and Boston University player finished last season (13 games, eight points) in the ECHL with Reading. He could be an ECHL/AHL depth option. The Flyers no longer officially hold his NHL rights. However, the Royals/Phantoms have him for one more year.

Ilya Pautov (W): The Flyers made the 2024 sixth-round pick a surprise ELC signing on June 1, 2026. He's very small but also highly skilled. However, Pautov lacks even KHL experience. The organization has a few options with the 20-year-old. If he doesn't earn an immediate Phantoms spot, the Flyers could loan him to a European team. It would burn the first year of his entry-level deal in either case.

Noah Powell (W): The power winger and fifth-round selection out of Arizona State dressed in 16 games for the Phantoms.

Riley Thompson (C): The Flyers signed Thompspon as an undrafted free agent out of Ohio State on March 26, 2026. He appeared in nine late season games for the Phantoms.

DEVELOPMENTAL CROSSROADS: 2ND YEAR PROS

The group of players spent all of last season at the pro level. They had uneven results. Each still has time on his Entry-Level deal to make a developmental leap. However, it's important that they do so sooner rather than later.

Carson Bjarnason (G): The 2023 second-round pick got off to a surprisingly strong start for the Phantoms early in his first pro year. Unfortunately, Bjarnason was unable to sustain it. As the season progressed, Bjarnason struggled considerably. He eventually saw ECHL time with Reading. However, he's hardly the first goaltender to hit a wall as a rookie.

Devin Kaplan (W): The power forward had an early season three-point game for the Phantoms. Thereafter, the former Boston University winger had a very uneven rookie AHL season. The Flyers burned the first year of his ELC the prior year with a one-game NHL stint. The 22-year-old is a restricted free agent after the 2026-27 season.

UNSIGNED DRAFTEES

This group is divided between Draft +1 and Draft +2 prospects. The former group consists of players selected in the 2026 Draft. They will get their first taste of an NHL camp. There's no rush to sign them.

Matthew Gard (C): On June 1, Gard committed to Michigan State, starting in the 207-28 season. He will play one final WHL season for the Seattle Thunderbirds this season. However, the clock freezes on his NHL signing window while committed to the NCAA. The Flyers like the big forward's size, physicality and upside as a potential bottom-six forward of the future. Philly selected him late in the second round of the 2025 Draft.

Brek Liske (D): The Flyers 2026 second-round pick enters his Draft +1 season with the defending WHL champion Everett Silvertips. He came on strong in the second half of last season, especially in the playoffs. The lifelong Flyers fan attended Development Camp with Philly and the World Junior Summer Showcase with Team Canada.

Martin Psohlavec (G): The Flyers liked what they saw of both Czech goalies at the Under-18 Worlds this spring. Philly ended up drafting both of them in 2026. Psohlavec, a second-round draftee, is the more highly touted of the two. He had an excellent 2025-26 season in his domestic league in Czechia.

Nathan Quinn (C/W): The smallish Quebec Remparts forward took a big offensive step during the 2025-26 regular season. The D+2 player (7th round, 2025) still has work to do in order to earn an entry-level contract. His QMJHL scoring stats won't get him there in and of themselves.

K.J. Sauer (C): The Flyers took the big high school/ USHL power forward in the fifth round of the 2026 Draft. He will head to the NCAA come 2027-28 for UMD (Minnesota Duluth). Sauer is a multi-year developmental player. He won't fast track to the pros.

Marek Sklenicka (G): 2026 fourth-rounder Sklenicka already came over to North America last season. He showed flashes of strong play in the WHL over 42 games with the Seattle Thunderbirds.

Luke Vlooswyk (D): Liske's Everett teammate enters his D+2 season. Philly likes his size (6-foot-5, 210 pounds), mobility and raw tools. However, the 2025 fifth-round needs a breakout overall season to land a coveted ELC by June.
